




UWC Institutional Operating Plan

Aims to enhance the <u>use of data analytics</u> in the development of evidence-driven student success initiatives. Furthermore, to invest in <u>resources to support targeted interventions</u> and approaches that have the potential to make a demonstrable difference.

Three sub-projects: Objectives Outlined in UWC's Proposal (2020 -2023)

- 1. Strengthen the university's business intelligence capacity and analytical capabilities.
- 2. Use learning analytics to enhance student support interventions (academic & Psycho-social).
- 3. Holistic support interventions for high-priority (at-risk) modules.



- Navigating student support






FYE/Mentoring Programme






High Priority Modules: First Year



Data Analytics


- Data Analytics Working Group held a 3-day workshop
 - ✓ Reflect on the current state of data and reporting.
 - ✓ Develop a data and reporting strategy
 - ✓ Developed a roadmap
- Continue to strengthen the use of data and analytics for decision-making, including increasing BI data capabilities (data and process).
- Develop a Data literacy Programme and offer Data Literacy Workshops (Short course – accredited)
- Data Colloquium Academic Week August 2023
- Approval of the Ethical Use of Data Policy ongoing

Do you have a good understanding of the meaning of all the data elements that you capture and/or manage?





Response Rate: 75%


Data Literacy & Training


