Introduction

The transition to higher education presents numerous challenges for students, critically affecting the success of first-year students. Despite targeted interventions aimed at addressing institutional issues such as retention rates, student success, and low throughput rates, these challenges persist. - Create an enhancing and enabling environment that is supportive of holistic development and success





OVERVIEW OF THE PROGRAM	
Vice-Chancellor's Address and Welcome Day	The Vice-Chancellor and Principal extend a warm welcome to first-year students and their parents. Students are provided with essential information about academic support and available services to help them feel a sense of belonging and supported.
Residence Life for Success	Student Housing and Residence Life welcomes students living in the residences. This session also provides a platform to inform students about the extracurricular activities available across the campus.
Faculty Day	Students are introduced to their faculties, where they meet the Executive Deans, Heads of Departments, and faculty staff members. Additionally, they are informed about the various academic support initiatives available within their faculties.
Team-building and Sport Day	On the last day of the program, students participate in team-building activities and a sports day. This event provides a platform for students to form lasting relationships with one another.















Cultivating Holistic Student Support through ADAPT@DUT

Student success beyond the academic engagement and results, but skills and behaviours, enacting knowledges to improve lives and livelihoods.

The holistic approach to student development has identified dimensions, including; the need for students transition and adapt to the university environment; the need for curricula to be designed to support students' personal engagement with disciplinary and professional knowledge; the need for students to experience teaching and learning in ways that are supportive and set high standards (McLean,et al, 2015).

- Promotion of academic engagement in creating a holistic learning experience. ADAPT@DUT encouraged involvement on cocurricular programing and its impact on engagement and development.






Gender




Prior coming to DUT



Age






Expectations before coming to DUT









