- Students' voices provide valuable feedback on teaching and learning, curriculum design, and support services
- It helps to identify areas for improvement and innovation (Cook-Sather, 2024).



## Importance of student voices (contd)

- Students' voices is crucial role in shaping the learning environment and overall success of students.
- Actively engaging with students and incorporating their perspectives into decision-making processes, a more inclusive and supportive environment for student success can be created (Lloyd, 2020).
- By actively seeking out and listening to students' voices, institutions can identify areas for improvement and make meaningful changes that positively impact student success rates (Kleynhans, 2018).



## Importance of student voices (contd)

- Create spaces for students to share their experiences and perspectives.
- Institutions need to actively listen to and incorporate student voices into their decision-making processes to create an environment that supports student success (Moeketsi, 2019)
- The importance of amplifying the voices of historically marginalized students create a more inclusive and equitable environment that supports success for all students (Makgoba, 2017)



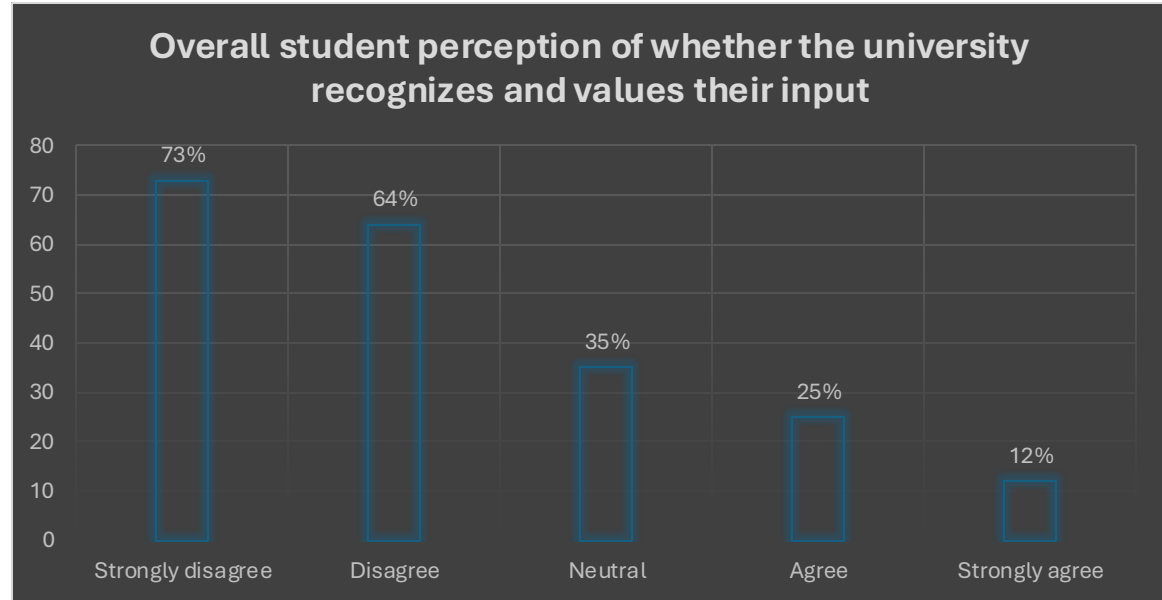
# Methodology
