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Lessons learned from Siyaphumelela 2.0

- Sustainability ideally the funding should be used as seed funding; dependency on Siyaphumelela funds not ideal for larger projects (Achieve; Intelliboard; FYS); new projects require human capacity that is not always sustainable (Q1-3); projects that were focused and driven by research rendered results (Hybrid Learning Research); institutional (ICT)
- Expenditure vs reach expensive projects with limited reach requires redesign or funding outside Siyaphumelela
- Regular reflective sessions needed project guidance, reflection, networking (co-leads)

Lessons learned from Siyaphumelela 2.0

- Focused approach needed
 – driven by data, institutional needs, and long-term benefits
- **Regional network** collaboration challenging in some regions



Siyaphumelela 3.0

- Less projects and more focused interventions
- 3 Focus areas based on student and institutional need
- Student Success Research addressing long-term matters of concern, e.g. African/Coloured male throughput; PG access and throughput
- HIP core module development Mandela Way for Students (bridging gap between curricular and co-curricular towards graduate development)
- Targeted transition support interventions, e.g. Q1-3 mentoring;
 Student Journal Project (Less funding larger reach/scaling)



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
